

MRS. A. D. KIDDER

Seldom has an announcement come to our village which has caused such genuine sorrow as that which was spread on Monday morning telling of the death of Mrs. A. D. Kidder, at her home in Royal Oak, the evening before.

Mrs. Kidder had been in her usual health all day and had entertained relatives, her mother and brother, Mrs. Winans and J. J. Winans, of Rochester, being of the number and returning home early in the evening. Other friends from Detroit left on the 8 o'clock car, and Mrs. Kidder waived her hand to them as their car left. A cousin, who had been staying at the Kidder home, coming in a moment later found Mrs. Kidder dead on the floor, she having expired from heart disease.

Mrs. Kidder was 35 years of age and had spent several years with her husband in Rochester where she was beloved for her womanly qualities and her bright sunshiny nature. She was devoted to her friends and home and her beauty of character will not soon be forgotten. All with whom she came in contact realize that the world is the poorer for her having left it. She leaves a husband, but no children.

The funeral services were held on Wednesday at 1 pm at the house, Rev. Lee S. McColleston of Detroit, officiating, and the remains taken to the former home of the deceased near Batavia, NY for burial. A profusion of beautiful flowers were sent by sorrowing friends and in silently expressing sympathy, told of the loving remembrance in which she was held.
