

HIRAM LAMBERTSON

Hiram Lambertson died at his late home in Caro last Thursday (Dec 9, 1894), week from the effects of a cancerous tumor of the stomach, aged 70 years. He had been ailing for upwards of a year. His remains were brought to Rochester, his old home, Friday evening and interment was made on Sunday, from the residence of B. F. Rhodes, under a Masonic auspices. Hiram Lambertson until his removal to Caro about eight years ago, was a prominent businessman of Rochester. In company with his brother, John V., he built the Lambertson House (now Hotel St. James) about forty-four years ago and ran it for a few years. They then went into the mercantile business on the site now occupied by the Morse block. When the building was destroyed by fire in 1868 they purchased the north west Main st. corner lot of Seneca Newberry and erected a brick building. He was always associated with () in business. Hiram Lambertson was a man highly revered by all who knew him, being of a pure heart, kindly and gentle disposition. He will be missed by a large circle of friends. Besides his wife and brother, he leaves a sister, Mrs. Gilbert Birdsall, of Honey Grove, Texas.
