

AUGUSTA PIXLEY OLIVER

Mrs. Augusta Oliver, wife of John E. Oliver, of Greenville, died at her late home last Saturday, May 25, 1899, aged 55 years. The remains were brought to Rochester and buried from the residence of Mrs. M. Lambertson last Wednesday afternoon, under the auspices of the Order of the Eastern Star, of which the deceased was a member. Mrs. Oliver was a daughter of the late Jonathan Pixley, one of Avon's pioneers, and was a sister to the Mesdames G. W. Vandeventer and Mary Lambertson and the Misses Pixley, of Rochester, and David Pixley of South Avon. The deceased had but lately returned to Greenville from a visit to her old home in Avon. She was a lady much esteemed and leaves a husband, four children and a host of friends to mourn her departure.

Augusta Pixley was born in Avon, Jan 8, 1844; married in 1861 to Mr. John E. Oliver; in 1864 they removed to Greenville, Montcalm Co., which has since been their home. Four children survive, three being buried in Rochester Cemetery.

Mr. J. E. Oliver and two daughters, Misses Bessie and Grace, and son John Jr. accompanied the remains to Rochester. Mr. And Mrs. W. E. Loomis and daughter, of Detroit, were also in attendance at the funeral.
